**Dr. Elmer Dunbar** received his bachelor's degree in biology and chemistry at Keene State College in New Hampshire in 1973. His medical degree is from the University of Louisville School of Medicine, where he specialized in Anesthesiology. He then completed his residency at the University's Affiliated Hospitals before moving to the Department of Anesthesiology at the University of Cincinnati's Affiliated Hospitals.

He has served as Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Department of Anesthesia at Humana Hospital Audubon in Louisville and as Medical Director of the Hospital's Day Surgery Center.

His involvement in programs with the Anesthesia Patient Safety Foundation has brought about improved monitoring of patients, improved machine safety, and improved education of the physician.

In 1992, he volunteered to be part of the Healthcare Leadership Council's Romanian Assistance Project, and traveled to Romania with other members of a cardiovascular team. While there, he helped to train Romanian physicians and nurses in cardiovascular anesthesia.

He is a charter member of 100 Black Men of Louisville, a nonprofit organization of African-American businessmen and other professionals, making a commitment of mentoring young African-American men in Louisville. He is also a member of Sigma Pi Pi Fraternity, Psi Boule Chapter.

He is currently the President of the Kentucky Society of Interventional Pain Physicians and serves as Vice-President – Strategic Planning of the American Society of Interventional Pain Physicians.

He is a member of the Board of Trustees Alumni Board at the University of Louisville School of Medicine and the Legislative Chairman for the Kentucky Society of Anesthesiologists.

He is the Medical Director for Pain Control Network, PSC in Louisville, while holding the position of CEO for PCN Surgical Suites, LLC.
